## FOREWORD

Although it has been the custom in the past to present a new directory every five years, this issue of the GEOGRAPHIC number of the *Plume of Tau Epsilon Phi* is the first published since 1939. Normally an issue would have been presented in 1944, but due to the fact that almost two thirds of the membership of the fraternity were in the service and most fraternity activities were at a standstill, it was wisely decided to postpone the publication of the directory. Since the end of World War II, the National Executive Offices have made every effort to locate the vast number of TEP men who, as a result of the War, became "lost." Finally, in the Spring of 1950, when most of the brothers were located in fairly permanent addresses, it was decided by the Grand Council to proceed with the publication.

No directory of this kind can possibly achieve one hundred percent accuracy, particularly where most of the brothers live in urban centers. The National Office will be grateful for any notice of correction, omission, misspelling and the like so that its records may be kept up to date.

Instead of a separate commercial and professional directory, we have listed the business and professional men of the fraternity in bold face type in their respective cities. This facilitates finding your fraternity brothers, and their business and profession, in your home town.
