Ponchak of Phi Eta Named Undergrad of Year 1976

AT the June meeting of the Grand Council and Scholarship Fund Trustees, the outstanding TEP undergraduates were honored by being granted scholarship grants in recognition of their outstanding achievements in scholarship, extracurricular activities, and fraternity service. Leading in all categories, Brother Steve Ponchak, currently President of the Johns Hopkins University Student Body, and possessor of a 3.6 scholastic average was designated 1976 Undergraduate of the Year of the Fraternity and recipient of the I. Schwartz Scholarship. In addition to the cash prize awarded, each recipient receives a beautifully engraved plaque for display. Recipients of awards not shown are as follows: The Leon Schneider Memorial Scholarship — Gary T. Shmerling, Omega (North Carolina).

New Award to be Given at Conventions

AT the February 1976 meeting of the Executive Committee of Grand Council, a proposal presented by the Rho Delta Rho Chapter Alumni Association for the creation of a new award to be presented at all conventions starting with the 1977 Convention. This award was discussed and reviewed by the Executive Committee and approved unanimously. The Rho Delta Rho Alumni Association, upon approval of the award, donated \$350.00 to establish a principal fund to insure that the award can be presented at all future conventions.

The new award is the LOWELL ROSEMAN ALUMNUS AWARD which is to be given to an outstanding alumnus for his achievements and contributions toward the success, improvement, and continued excellence of the chapter of TEP in which he was an undergraduate member. The award will be presented on the basis of continued involvement, unselfish contribution, and the advancement of his chapter both in relation to the National Fraternity and the local and campus community of the chapter.

This is an extremely unique award because of several reasons. It is the first alumnus award to recognize the contributions strictly toward his own chapter. It is also a national award, in that, it is through the continued and dedicated involvement of alumni at a chapter that Tau Epsilon Phi Fraternity remains the strong and viable fraternity

that it has become and the National is honored to recognize the contributions of these dedicated individuals through this award.

Finally, the award is named after a person who has and still is involved actively in his own alumni association. As you well know, the Rho Delta Rho Chapter was the recipient of the last Chapter of Merit Award at the 1975 Convention in Atlanta. During the time that the Rho Deltas were on their way to attaining this award, the Alumni Association was under the direction of Lowell Roseman as President. Since his involvement in the RDR Alumni Assoc. in 1967, Lowell has worked with the chapter to take an average \$3000.00 per year budget deficit and turn it into a chapter that has operated in the black every semester since the spring of 1970. During this time, the chapter, under the program formula devised by Lowell, has established a considerable reserve fund. At the last convention, Lowell Roseman was elected to serve as a member of the Scholarship and Trustee Committee of National. The Rho Deltas have been among our strongest chapters for several years now and with the continued involvement of Lowell Roseman, we have every expectation that they will remain so.

There are many other "Lowell Rosemans" within our fraternity. Through this award we will now be able to recognize these people in the future.

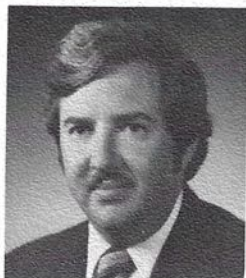
