## Louis Harris TEP Man of the Year

Louis Harris, one of the leading analysts of public opinion and the father of modern election night early projections, was honored as Tau Epsilon Phi's 1981 TEP Man of the Year. He was initiated by Omega Chapter at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1939.

Bro. Harris has been in the field of public opinion and marketing research since 1947. He joined the Elmo Roper firm as Mr. Roper's assistant and partner until 1956 when he set up his own firm, Louis Harris and Associates. From 1956 to 1963, the firm's most visible work was in the area of polling for political candidates, most notably for the late President John F. Kennedy. Bro. Harris not only did the polling, but he also served on the Kennedy strategy committee during the 1960 Presidential campaign. During this same period, Louis Harris and Associates served as consultant and polling arm in 214 elections in local, state and national campaigns in all fifty states.

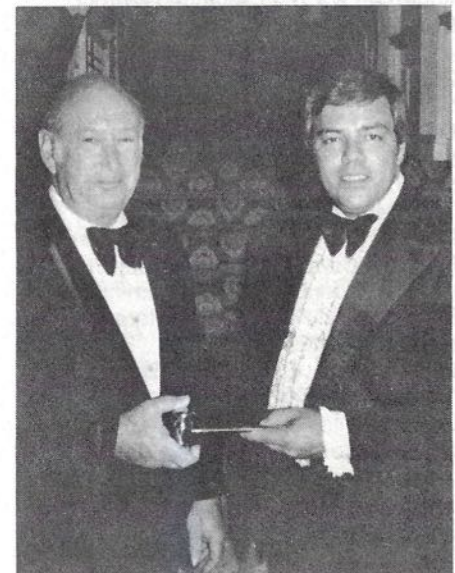
In the early 1960's Louis Harris pioneered major breakthroughs in the application of computer techniques to the use of survey data. These techniques, coupled with the creation of a key precinct sampling system, permitted the Harris organization to compile and present an indepth analysis of election returns within minutes after the closing of the polls. This technology is now used by all major networks in election coverage.

At present, Louis Harris and Associates employs a full-time professional staff of over 120 people in New York, Washington, D.C., London and Paris. Despite the increasing volume of editorial, governmental, and corporate business, Louis Harris still oversees the organization and analysis of studies, as well as personally writing his syndicated newspaper column.

Presently, Louis Harris has a non-salaried appointment on the Political Science faculty of the University of North Carolina. In addition, he has been Chairman of the Board of the American Council for the Arts since 1976. He had previously been a faculty member at Columbia University and was one of the original members of the Advisory Board of the Yale University School of Organization and Management. In 1976, he was awarded the Distinguished Alumni Award from the University of North Carolina.

Due to a prior commitment, Brother Harris was unable to accept his award. Fellow Omega TEP, Brother Vice Consul Al Schiff, accepting for Brother Harris, read the following message:

"I regret being unable to attend your meeting, due to an unbreakable previous commitment. "Let me thank you for your singular honor. I will try to wear it well. Fundamentally, I must tell you I do not believe in testimonials, nor do I seek honors. I have always admired the Frenchman Jean Monnet, the founder of the European Common Market, who said, 'Some people with power try to be somebody. Others just try to get things done.' I would like to take this occasion to tell you that I look fondly back to my days as a member of Omega at Chapel Hill. The associations, the period of growth, the fellowship, all bring back vivid and positive memories. There was some glue in that experience that helped hold me together in a highly formative period. Something must have taken as well in terms of my Jewish identity. For several years now, this identity has grown and has been nurtured by a deep interest in the capacity of organizations such as TEP to help others to achieve standards of excellence. A person must be at home with oneself in terms of his knowledge of what he is. I am happy to acknowledge that this is the way I feel. And I credit my experience with TEP as part of that process.

## Rho Delt Alumni Honor Swafford

Raymond Swafford became the first recipient of the Rho Delta Rho Alumni Memorial Scholarship at a banquet held on October 3, 1981. Swafford, Chancellor of the Rho Delta Rho Chapter at Illinois Institute of Technology, is a senior majoring in Chemical Engineering.

## Al Versacci Hunter '65 Elected Consul

Al Versacci's (Epsilon Mu — Hunter/Lehman '65) election to the Fraternity's highest post marks something of a first in this, and probably any, Fraternity's history. Al is not only the youngest President TEP has ever had, but also the first former member of the Fraternity's staff to be elected to the post. Al, who has been continually involved with Grand Council and the National Fraternity since Convention '65 when he was selected Undergraduate of the Year, held various leadership positions in his Chapter including Chancellor. He was the recipient of both the Chancellor's and Meritorious Service Keys. The latter is the highest award a Chapter may bestow.

Upon being graduated by Hunter College with a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science, Al was selected by both The TEP Foundation and the University of Southern California to pilot the Graduate Resident Advisor program at USC. Under the program USC provides a fellowship to Graduate Students who will reside in Fraternities or Sororities and provide on-site leadership and management guidance. The host Fraternity covers the GRA's room and board, and in TEP's case, up to an additional \$1,000 in tuition, books and fees.

The program founded by Al and TEP has become the model for many universities and was made a part of The TEP Foundation's permanent awards program with the establishment of the Sidney S. Sontag Scholar Award in 1979.

Al, the father of three daughters, Jennifer, Marguerite and Sarah, lives with his wife, the former Lois Levine, in New Rochelle where he is active with the Bloomingdale Estates Homeowners Association.

When not busy implementing his stated goal for TEP of "Growing where we are and Going where we aren't!", Al is Manager of Corporate Training and Management Development for Amerada Hess Corporation in New York. Brother Al is also active with his professional society, the American Society for Training and Development (ASTD), where he is affectionately known as "the Trainer's Trainer". In addition to serving as Consul and Trustee of The TEP Foundation, Al serves on the Editorial Advisory Board of ASTD's Journal. He was recently the recipient of the New York Chapter's Special Achievement Award for developing the Chapter's Placement Service, which has since become the model program for the ASTD nationally.

With Brother Versacci's professional knowledge of people, his two years as Assistant Executive Secretary under Sid Sontag, and his commitment to growth and expansion, things look great for TEP under his stewardship.

## Mamo Leaves TEP to found Christian Center for the Homeless

Brother George W. Mamo (Rutgers-Camden '76), who has served as the Fraternity/Foundation Executive Director since 1979, has left the Fraternity's employ to become Director of the Atlanta Action Alliance's "Street People" Program.

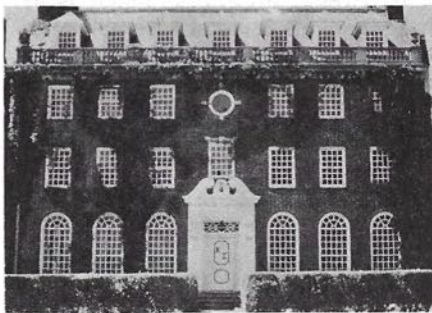
The Alliance is a coalition of downtown Christian churches and the business community dedicated to presenting the Christian alternative to the problems of unemployment, crime and poverty. For the homeless program, the Alliance has brought together five major downtown churches of varying denominations and the business community to jointly fund a day center. The center will provide a total ministry, to both the physical and spiritual needs of the estimated 2,000 homeless who live on the streets of Atlanta.

As Director, Brother Mamo will be responsible for the renovation of the 10,000 square foot facility, the day-to-day supervision of the center, the recruitment, training, supervision and coordination of volunteers from the community and participating churches, as well as fund-raising and development work.

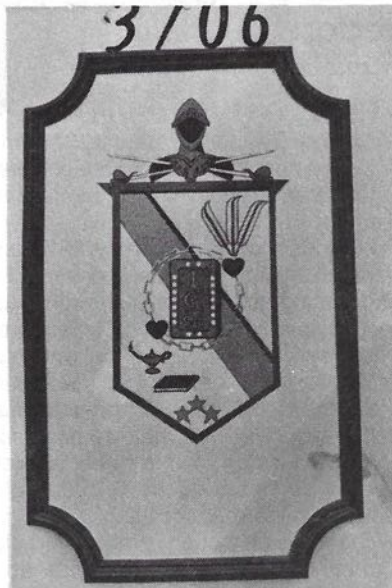
During his time with TEP, Brother George completely revamped the accounting and record keeping systems of both the Fraternity and Foundation; created TEP Properties to handle the Fraternity's real estate, loan and mortgage portfolios in a more businesslike manner; fully computerized our budgeting and billing systems; and regained the Foundation's public charity status. We also saw the chartering of two new chapters (Husson College and UMPI), the re-chartering of Rho (U. of Pennsylvania), the recolonization of Alpha (Columbia), Theta (Boston) and Sigma Alpha Sigma (Hofstra), as well as new colonies at UNC — Asheville and Cal Poly/Pomona, during George's tenure.

## Rho Rechartered Goldman Honored

For Rho Chapter at the University of Pennsylvania, this year's Homecoming was a very special event. In addition to celebrating Penn's victory over the Yale Bulldogs, TEP Alumni celebrated the re-chartering of their chapter, dormant since 1970. Another highlight of the evening came when Consul Al Versacci personally presented The Meritorious Service Key to Brother Goldman. The Meritorious Service Key is the highest award a chapter may bestow.

The affair was attended by many notable alums, among them Fred Mann, Rho 14, initiated in 1922.
